Farm works with flies Project

We started and completed the farm works with flies project which equipped 30 rural farmers in Akinyele local government area, Ibadan, Nigeria with necessary skill to convert their household and farm wastes to resources. This process is done with the instrumentality of the Black Soldier Fly (BSF). This training was hands on equipping our farmers with necessary skill to transition to using circular methods with nature. The journey to sustainability began.

In October our founder was the keynote speaker and a member of the Jury at the University of Eldoret, Kenya for the Venture4Change idea competition. Venture4change contributes to developing the next generation of leaders and innovators in health. Venture4Change equips young people with core changemaker skills - empathy, teamwork, innovative leadership, social entrepreneurial knowledge, and practical problem-solving abilities.

Eight teams from three universities (Moi University, Kibabii University, and the University of Eldoret) presented sustainable solutions to tackle waste management in rapidly growing urban areas.

Out of 8 ideas, 3 were selected to initiate their prototype with financial support as well as mentorship. We strongly believe all ideas were great and will make real change happen.

We were happy to share our work at Entojutu. I was happy to see that our future is secured and that there is no such thing as waste but opportunities with this crop of budding social entrepreneurs in Africa. Their passion for solving problems was contagious and hard work was evident.
