

Entojutu Hosts Green Shiro Ltd and Girl Potential Care Center

It was a pleasure to host Kaligirwa Bridget Kigambo and her team from Green Shero Ltd and Girl Potential Care Center from Uganda at our facility on August 9th, 2024. The visit was a valuable exchange of knowledge, ideas, and solutions, focusing on sustainable agriculture, waste management approaches, and nature-based solutions. Our discussions highlighted the importance of integrated waste management strategies, including reduction, reuse, recycling, and recovery. We shared our own approach to waste management, which includes collecting tonnes of waste from the local market every week. This waste is then converted into valuable resources through our Black Soldier Fly larvae program, producing a weekly output of protein-rich larvae and nutrient-dense frass that's used to fertilize our farm. This closed-loop system exemplifies our commitment to minimizing waste and maximizing resource efficiency. We explored innovative approaches to waste management, such as:

- Utilizing Black Soldier Flies for organic waste decomposition and nutrient cycling Implementing composting programs for food waste and agricultural by-products.
- Designing circular systems for minimal waste generation. The visit underscored the significance of collaboration among impact-driven entrepreneurs in driving positive change towards a more sustainable future.

Highlights from the visit include: - Facility tour and knowledge exchange - Dialogue on localized solutions for sustainable agriculture and waste management - Exploration of nature-based strategies and innovative technologies - Networking opportunities for potential collaborations

Harvesting Success with Organic Frass.

Our black soldier fly larvae have efficiently transformed organic waste into nutrient-rich frass. We are delighted to announce the successful cultivation of vegetables and tomatoes using this organic frass as a natural fertilizer on June 25, 2024.

The Impact: Through the utilization of our black soldier fly larvae's frass, we are achieving several significant outcomes: Decreasing waste generation and reducing our environmental impact. Establishing a closed-loop system to support sustainable agricultural practices Producing chemical-free, healthy produce in the form of vegetables and tomatoes for human consumption.

We are currently expanding our lavearium thereby increasing our waste collection from the local market to enhance frass production capacity and are actively exploring new potential applications for this organic fertilizer.
