This process ensures that waste is recycled efficiently, driving our efforts toward a circular economy where waste is minimized, and valuable byproducts are used to boost food production.

This weekly activity is an integral part of Entojutu's ongoing commitment to sustainability. By managing waste responsibly, we not only contribute to the health of our local environment but also ensure that our farming practices remain aligned with our broader goal of sustainable agriculture. We believe that these efforts are crucial for fostering long-term food security, environmental resilience, and the overall well-being of our communities.
